- It depends on how we are raised and our experiences (not strong)

- It's human nature to survive and sometimes you have to put others above yourself to do that
- It's human nature to want to be liked and you can do that by putting others above yourself
- You can put others above yourself for selfish reasons
- The argument is not if it's human nature to be selfish. It is that it's human nature to put yourself about others
- We put others above ourselves because if we see someone struggling it's human nature to want to help them
- **People do put themselves above others but it's not human nature**
- You can balance putting others above yourself and yourself above others. E.g. piggy's glasses got stolen so Ralph went to get them back so he could start the fire and so piggy could see.
- You can put others above yourself but still be selfish (Save for rebuttal)
- It is not in our nature to put ourselves above others
- Saying we put "ourselves" meaning you personally above other people is untrue because it is in our human nature to put our family and community above other people. As humans we need other humans. Our bodies are wired for social contact and that we do better physically and mentally when we have human contact.

**Defining human nature:** the general psychological characteristics, feelings, and behavioral traits of humankind, regarded as shared by all humans.

**The keyword in this statement is human nature, which are the traits that humans follow. The kids on the island were a community, they were all in it together. They hunted together, bonded together, they all had a sense of empathy for each other. Later on, they became more and more isolated, and that drives people to go away from human nature and what's right.**
