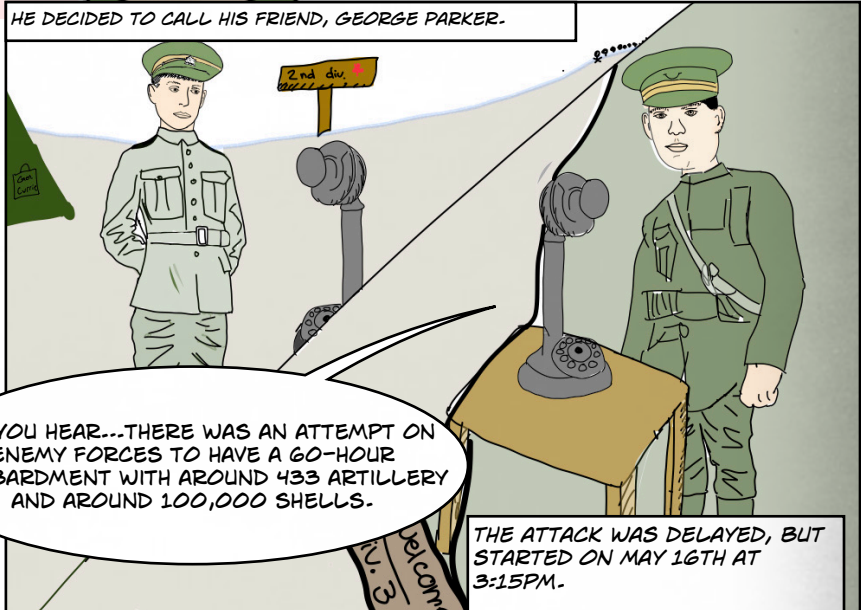
THERE WAS ONCE A YOUNG MAN NAMED JACK JONES, WHO MISSED HIS FRIEND.



IN 1915 HE WAS CONTINUALLY TRAINING IN CANADIAN FORCES' SECOND DIVISION.



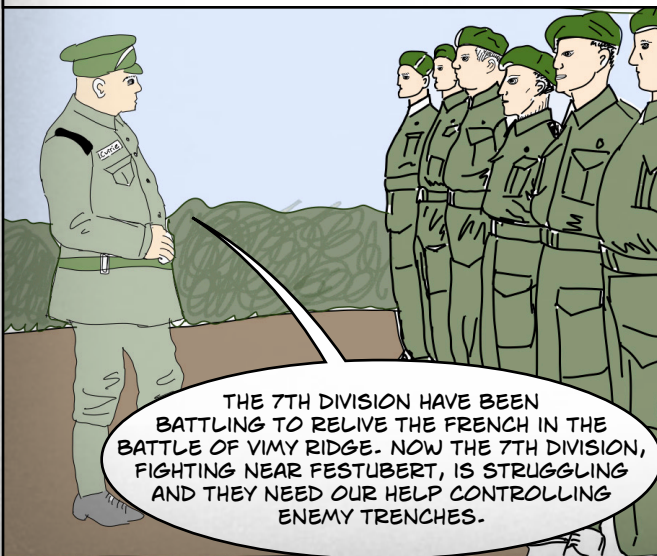
HE DECIDED TO CALL HIS FRIEND, GEORGE PARKER.

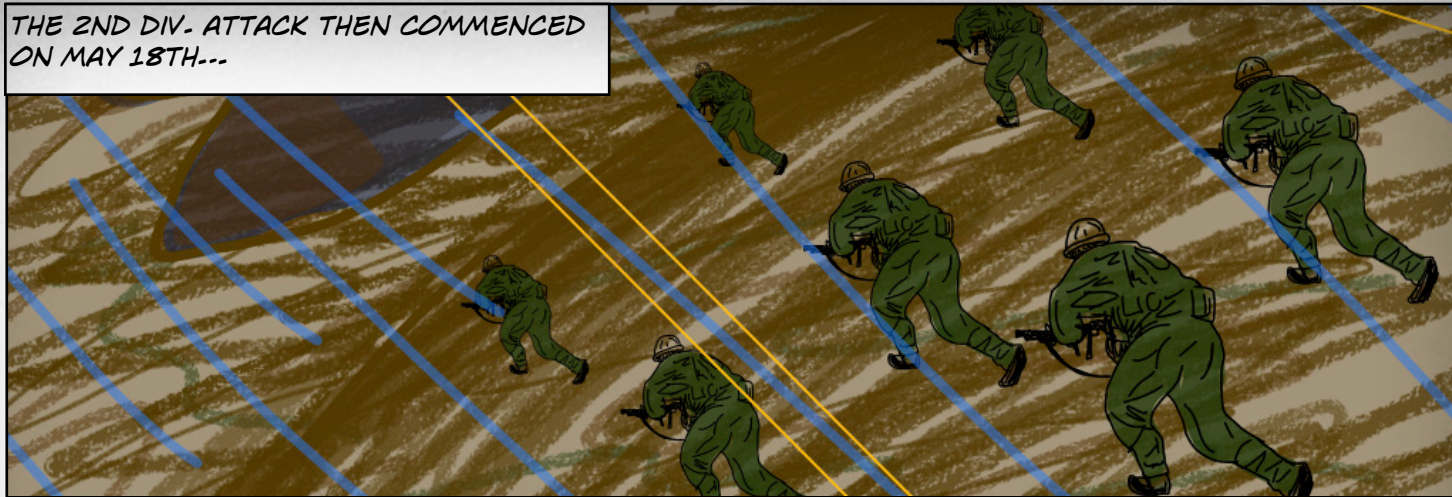
DURING GEORGE'S 3RD DIVISION TRAINING...



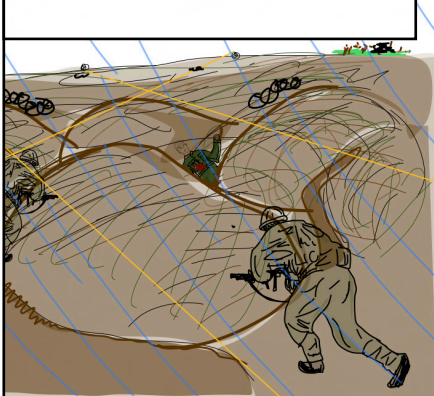

BY MAY 19TH THE 7TH AND 2ND DIVISION WERE ABLE TO RETREAT...



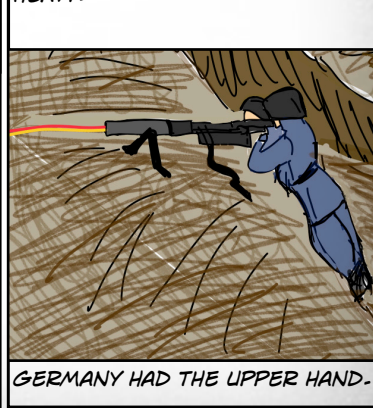
ALSO, ON MAY 18TH THE 1ST CANADIAN DIVISION CAME TO HELP THE 51ST BRITISH DIVISION...



THE BATTLE CONTINUED. THE ALLIES WERE ABLE TO DIG A NEW FRONT LINE.



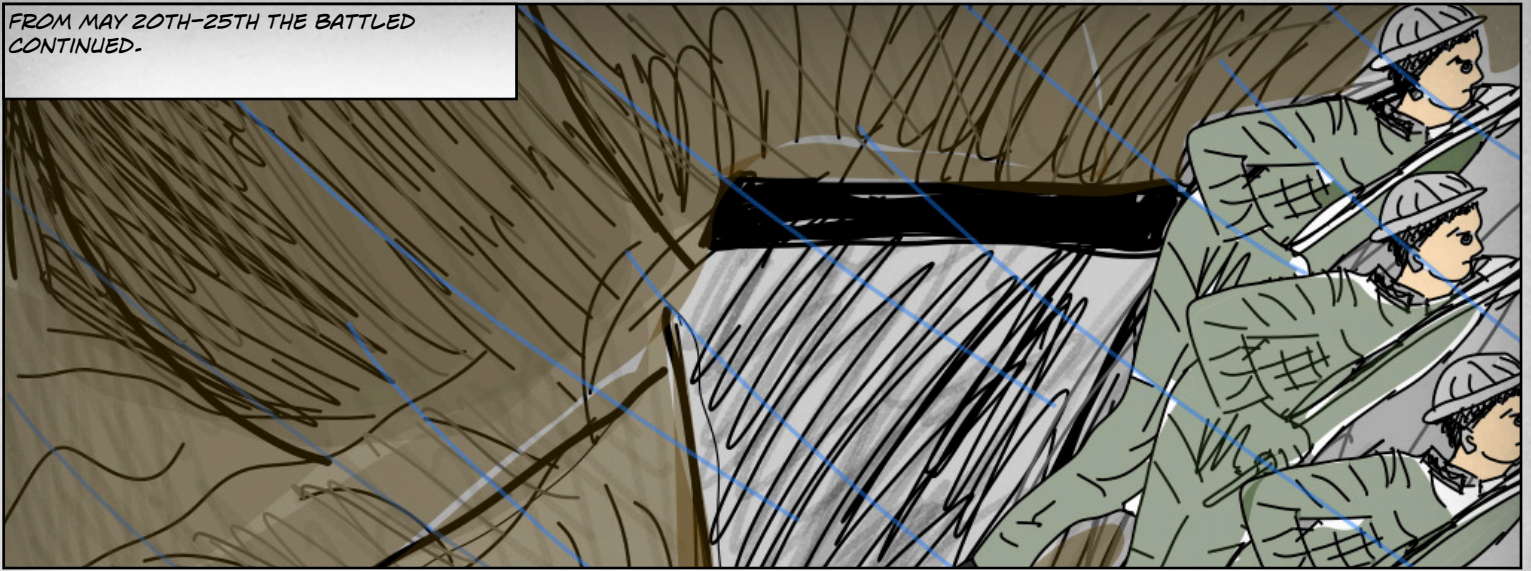
BUT ENEMY FIRE WAS STILL HEAVY.



GERMANY HAD THE UPPER HAND.



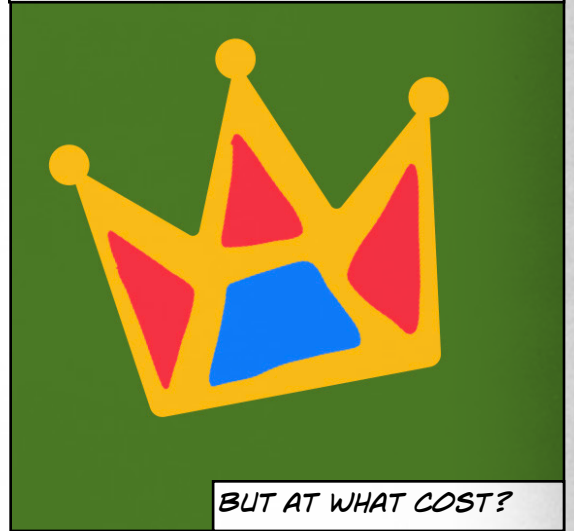
FROM MAY 20TH-25TH THE BATTLED CONTINUED.
