Audience	<p>The audience for our project will be anyone with access to the internet as we will be posting our paragraphs online. This will be important to consider when writing as some people reading may feel differently or think differently than we do. We will have to be careful with our word choices as some things we say may close the minds of some readers. For example, it will be important not to disrespect other nations and their role in D-Day as this would make readers from other countries unhappy, and cause them to disregard the article.</p>	<p>I must not be callous in my words and make sure that what I say doesn't offend anyone who had family on D-Day. I must also make sure not to discredit other nations, or ethnicity groups by understating their roles as well. For example I must do some research on Indigenous peoples' roles on D-Day. To make sure they get the credit they deserve.</p>
Topic	<p>My topic will be about how the world we live in is built off of WW2, and why it's important to preserve the Juno Beach Center. With this topic I can explore the actions taken post world war and how those actions are a direct result of the world we live in today. The Juno Beach Center is important, as it serves as a reminder of what happened and how it can never happen again. A factor to consider will be the proposed condo development and how it would impact the JBC.</p>	<p>I must remember not to stray from my topic and stay focused on it, to make sure the readers can clearly understand the point of my writing.</p>
Writer	<p>As the writer I will need to make strong key points about why and how the JBC is important in today's society. I will have to be clear about the impacts of the post war era and how it has impacted today.</p>	<p>I must remember to spell and grammar check, have accurate sources. To make the reader trust me on what I'm saying. If not then my ideas may not be received well or at all.</p>
