INTRO SKIT

IN THE FOREST - DAY

Two friends are exhausted at the end of a long hike. At the end of their hike they see a SET OF STAIRS. They walk down the stairs and come out at a GAS STATION. The friends are talking about how thirsty they are.

OUTSIDE - DAY, TOP OF STAIRCASE BY MY HOUSE

PERSON 1

Today was such a nice day for a hike. Nice and sunny.

PERSON 2

(While walking down the stairs)

Yeah, too bad we forgot water. I'm so thirsty I could just die.

PERSON 1

(As they come out at the bottom of the stairs)

Hey look! A gas station. We should go in and get something to drink.

PERSON 2

(As they are walking on the road which is at the bottom of the stairs towards the gas station)

That sounds like a good idea.

GAS STATION - INT/EXT DAY BY MY HOUSE

CLOSE UP OF THE FRIENDS OPENING THE DOOR

The two friends arrive at the doors of the gas station. They go inside and grab two WATER BOTTLES. When they go to check out, one of them grabs a CANDY BAR.

(While grabbing
their wallet)

PERSON 1

This is the best candy bar ever you
should get one.

(While grabbing their
wallet)

PERSON 2

Nah, those ones are nasty

Person 1 then shakes their head and goes to pay. The cashier rings up their purchase.

CLOSE UP OF THE MONEY GOING FROM HAND OF PERSON 1 + 2 TO
CASHIER AND THEM GETTING THEIR DRINKS1

WALKING DOWN THE STREET - BY MY HOUSE

The two friends continue on their walk down a street. While they are walking, they are drinking and eating what they bought. They come up to a Trashcan and recycling can on the side of the road. By this point, Person 1 has finished their drink.

CLOSE UP OF TRASHCAN AND RECYCLING BIN

THEN CLOSE UP OF PERSON 1 THROWING THEIR RECYCLING INTO THE
TRASH BIN

CUT TO VOICE
OVER OF PANNING
SHOT DUMPS -
SUSPENSEFUL
MUSIC BEGINS.
