Young workers have a right to be safe and you have a right to refuse unsafe work. Most of you will have completed WorkSafe in Careers 10 and received a certificate to show that you passed that course. We may have that on file. Check with Ms. Knapp to check that we have evidence of this certificate.

Before you can start your work placement, we want to make sure you have the necessary skills and knowledge to keep yourself safe. Be sure you feel comfortable with the work safety topics below <u>AND</u> show evidence that you have completed the WorkSafeBC Quiz.
